

Annex I

Challenge Cup (President’s Cup) for the International Team Championship

1. The FEI presents a Challenge Cup for the International Team Jumping Championship.
2. The period of the competition is from 1st December of one year until the 30th November in the following year.
3. The classification of the Challenge Cup is decided by the following point system:

4. If a nation takes part in more than 6 competitions, only their 6 best scores are counted.
5. Should a nation retire after the commencement of the competition and so be unplaced, its team will receive no points.
6. In case of equality for any place, the points will be shared.
7. In the event of an equality of points for the Championship at the end of the year, the champion nation will be the one with the greatest number of wins in the competitions. If there is still an equality of points, it will be the nation with the greatest number of second places and so on.

In the event of an equality of points for first place or for the longer placing in the Nations’ Cup Series at the end of the Nations’ Cup season, the classification will be decided by the greatest number of wins out of the six competitions counting for points. If there is still an equality for any classification, the team with the greatest number of second placing wins and so on until there are no more *ex aequo* (a maximum of six Nations’ Cup scores to count for any one team).

8. The Challenge Cup will be presented to the delegate of the winning nation, at the General Assembly of the FEI.

Annex II

FEI Badges of Honour

8. FEI Badges of Honour for Jumping will be awarded to those competitors who have completed the first round of a Nations Cup, the Team and/or Individual Competition at the Olympic Games and the World and Senior Continental Team and/or Individual Championships, without retiring or being eliminated on the following scale:

- A Gold Badge for completing 40 Nations Cup competitions.
- A Silver Badge for completing 20 Nations Cup competitions.
- A Bronze Badge for completing 10 Nations Cup competitions.

9. All count as 5 Nations Cup competitions:

- the Team and/or Individual Competition at the Olympic Games
- the Team and/or Individual World Championship.
- the Team and/or Individual Continental Championship

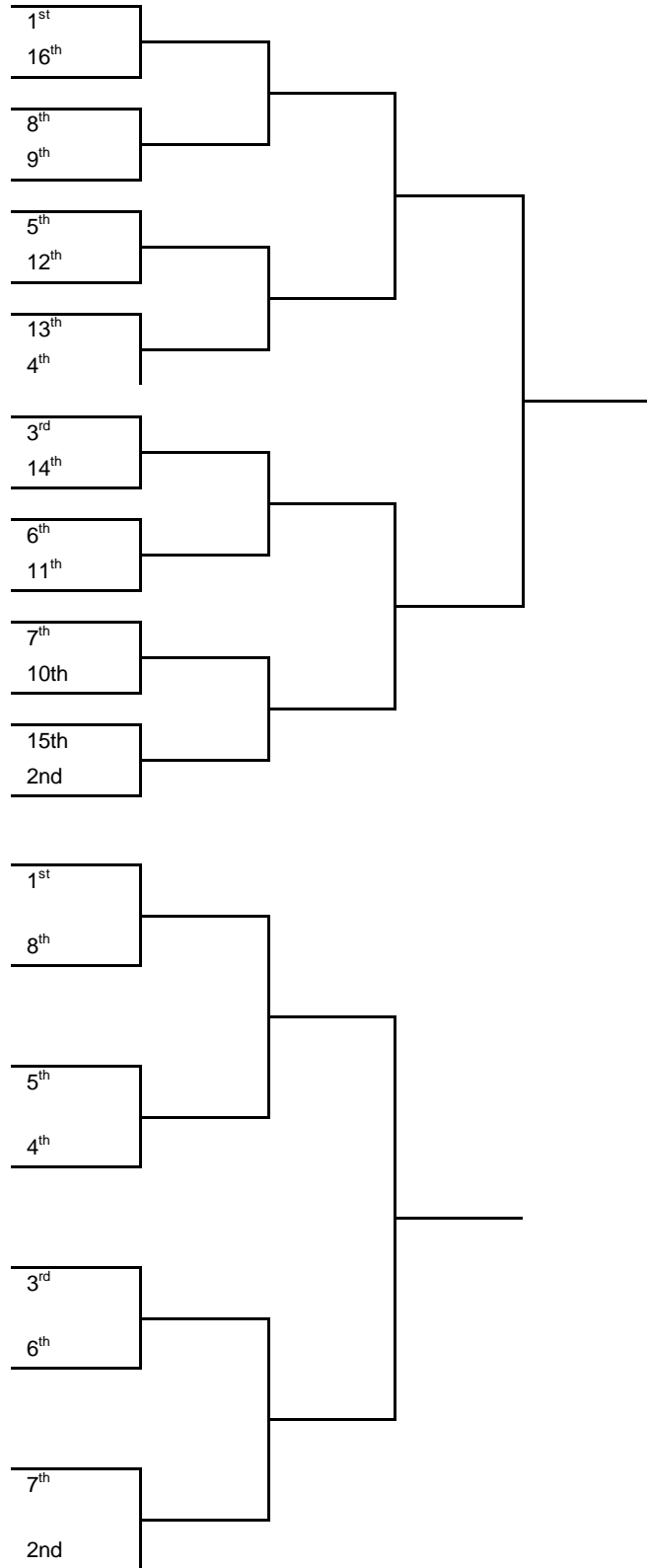
Annex VII

Qualification System for the Grand Prix at CSIOs (Article 266.4)

The following are automatically qualified for the Grand Prix at CSIOs, if present as official team members or individual:

1. The individual medal winners (competitor/horse) of the last Olympic and Pan-American Games, of the last World and Continental Championships and the first three competitors/horses in the last Final of the World Cup.
2. The winners (competitors/horses) of the Grand Prix at any CSIO during the last 12 months.
3. The remaining competitors are required to qualify during the Event itself.

Annex IX

Rotating the Starting order in Individual Competitions

1. At Events where the competitors are allowed to ride two or three horses in individual competitions, the following procedure is acceptable to achieve rotation of the starting order in the individual competitions included in the programme:

1.1. if the schedule provides that the same horse is allowed to take part in more than one individual competition per day and throughout the Event, the number of horses must be divided by the number of individual competitions;

1.2. if the schedule provides that the same horse is allowed to take part in only one competition per day and throughout the Event, the number of horses must be divided by the number of days on which individual competitions take place.

2. At Events where the schedule provides that competitors are allowed to ride only one horse in each individual competition, the competitors are drawn and their horses carry successive numbers:

- First competitor: 1, 2, 3 (number of his horses)
- Second competitor: 4, 5, ...

The rotation follows the same procedure as in paragraph 1., but in this case the number of competitors must be divided by the number of individual competitions or by the number of days on which individual competitions take place.
